About SPAF

The Third Annual **Singapore Performing Arts Festival (SPAF)** will be held ***in May 2014***. Since the Ministry of Education and government have embraced the significance of drama as part of the education process in Singapore, there has been an increasing demand for speech and communication activities amongst schools, parents and students. This unique event is specially tailored to the Primary and Secondary school students in Singapore.

SPAF is an Associate Member of The British and International Federation of Festivals of which Her Majesty the Queen is Patron. By being recognized by the British and International Federation of Festivals, Singapore will join not only the 300+ festivals in the UK but also the festivals in Sri Lanka, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, Canada and the USA.

Preparing for and participation in a Festival involves young people in group activity and individual achievement - every skill gained in preparing for and giving a performance is a valuable life skill which will be used in job interviews, in the workplace, in leisure activities and in social and interpersonal relationships throughout life.

Most will not make their career in the Arts but will become that educated audience who will keep the arts alive in the coming years. However the festival movement was where many famous names began their career, Julian Lloyd Webber, Maureen Lipman, Wayne Sleep, Dame Janet Baker, & Paul Scofield to name a few!

The adjudicator will be a certified Adjudicator of **The British and International Federation of Festivals**, a practicing professional who will not only make a skilled judgement, but who will also seek to inspire greater appreciation of the work being performed and remarks made in public and on the written report will evaluate and encourage the performers.

The Federation of Festivals is the umbrella body for competitive festivals of the performing arts across the UK and beyond. Festival performers receive verbal and written educational feedback from a professional adjudicator in music, dance or speech classes.

There are around **300 festivals affiliated** to the Federation. In 2010 Federation festivals attracted over ONE million performers reaching an audience of around FIVE million.

Who should Join?

- Just about **ANYONE!** who is interested in improving critical life skills such as:
 - o Effective Communication
 - o Confidence in presentation before an audience
- **EVERYONE!** This is the perfect festival to experience Speech & Drama whether you have little or no previous experience.
- From age 6 upwards.

What will each participant receive?

- A written report.
- A certificate of participation for achievement of above 75 marks.

How will the festival be conducted?

- Individual and Group Participants will be allocated classes based on their age.
- Individual entry Classes will be conducted in a hall that can seat about 50.
- Group entry Classes will be conducted in a ***small theatre***.
- Group size will be ***a minimum of 3 and maximum of 30***
- Each Class will last about an Hour depending on the age group and class type/size.
- During each class:
 - o Each individual or group participant will present their work in a pre-arranged order of performance.
 - o The adjudicator will evaluate their performance on a report form, which will be presented to the respective participants at the end of each class.
 - o After all the participants have presented their work, the adjudicator will conduct a master-class style to comment on the overall performance of the class as a whole.
 - o Certificates will be awarded to all participants, with 3rd, 2nd, and 1st placing acknowledged.
- Each participant or member of a group will be able to reserve up to 2 seats*, the rest of the seats will be released based on first come first serve reservation*.

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Festival Adjudicator: MRS MARY ANN TEAR



Mary Ann is a senior examiner and trainer for Trinity College London, a British Federation adjudicator, choreographer, director and Performing Arts lecturer and practitioner. She is now based in Singapore as the SEA Drama and Performance Consultant whilst still pursuing her Trinity examining, lecturing, and adjudicating. Her work has taken her to Malaysia, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, India, Canada, Sri Lanka, Dubai, Bermuda, as well as centres in Europe and the UK.

In her capacity as a Trinity College London examiner she pioneered the Young Performance Certificates believing these to be very important for pre-school children as they develop confidence, group interaction, and a sense of achievement through contact with the Arts.

She has always had an interest in teaching and ran her own schools in Hertfordshire for several years working with students of all ages in speech, drama and dance. She led a Youth Theatre and was involved with many community arts projects in the UK.

Mary Ann was a UK lecturer in Performing Arts working for the Universities of Hertfordshire and Middlesex, whilst also pursuing her professional theatrical career with performance, choreography, and direction in drama, musical theatre, pantomime and physical theatre something she still is actively involved in here in Singapore.

Her work now is primarily as a trainer of teachers in the fields of Drama, Communication Skills and Performance, promoting the Trinity College London philosophy of creative learning and teaching through the exploration of stimulating, challenging syllabuses.

Rules and Regulations – Please Read Carefully

- **ALL ENTRIES** must be on the Official Entry Form. (Further copies available from www.msworks.sg).
- Photocopied forms are acceptable.
- Please use a separate form for each entry.
- Cheques should be made payable to “**MS WORKS**”.
- **Closing Date: 10th April 2014** Late entries will not be accepted, please assist us by sending entries in early.
- **AGE** must be calculated as of 1 Jan **2014**
- **ELIGIBILITY** – The competitions are restricted to amateurs only. An amateur is considered to be one who does not derive the main part of their income from the discipline in which they proposes to enter the Festival. Holders of recognised drama diplomas and degrees may not compete in classes other than Open Classes.
- **OWN CHOICE**
 - o A copy of Own Choice Material **MUST** be handed to the Adjudicator’s Steward before any performance. Failure to do this may result in disqualification or a loss of marks.
 - o Adjudicator’s copies should be clearly marked with competitor’s name, class and the page number. Titles of ALL Own Choice Material **MUST** be stated on the entry form. The publisher must be given.
 - o Any changes of Own Choice Material **MUST** be notified to the organiser’s office through email (SPAF@msworks.sg) at least ONE WEEK before the date of the performance at the Festival. This is essential for administrative reasons and timing. Failure to do so may incur disqualification or a loss of marks.
 - o Competitors may not offer the same piece in more than one class.
 - o In classes where time limits are given, these are generous and pieces chosen should be well within them. Use of shorter pieces **will not** be penalised but the performance will have marks deducted if the time limit is exceeded.
 - o It is no longer necessary for competitors in Speech Own Choice Classes to seek copyright permission before performing poetry, prose or solo dramatic items (for details see Speech Section of the syllabus). However, it is still necessary to obtain permission from the owner of the Performing Right before performing Duologues and Group Drama.

- **CERTIFICATES** will be awarded as follows (*in accordance to The British Federation's regulations*):
 - o 75 - 77 - A Performance limited in its communication
 - o 78 - 80 - A performance showing development of technique and/or communication
 - o 81 - 83 - A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability
 - o 84 - 86 - A convincing performance technically and artistically
 - o 87 - 89 - A excellent performance technically and artistically
 - o 90+ - An exceptional performance technically and artistically
 - o In each group entries, there will be ONE report and ONE certificate.
- **The Adjudicator** may withhold any award and may stop any performance at their discretion. The decision in all cases shall be final. It is forbidden to communicate with the Adjudicator in any way.
- The organiser reserves the right to turn down any applications due to class capacity reached.
- The organiser reserves the right to make any changes to the above regulations, with or without prior notice.

VERSE SPEAKING CLASSES *(all poems spoken from memory)*

Class 1 (Age 6-7 YEARS)

Own Choice poem – maximum time 1 minute

Class 2 (Age 8-9 YEARS)

Own choice poem – maximum time 1.5 minutes

Class 3 (Age 10-11 YEARS)

Own choice poem – maximum time 2 minutes

Class 4 (Age 12-14 YEARS)

Two contrasting own choice poems- maximum time 3 minutes for both poems

Class 5 (Age 14-16 YEARS)

Two contrasting own choice poems – maximum time 4 minutes for both poems

Class 6 (Age 16-18 YEARS)

Three contrasting own poems with spoken links-maximum 5 minutes for the programme

Class 7 (Age Open - Over 18 YEARS)

Poetry recital of at least four poems that are thematically linked- minimum 6 minutes and maximum 8 minutes for the programme.

PUBLIC SPEAKING

Adjudication will be based on

Content - clarity, structure, focus, development, and knowledge of subject.

Communication & delivery techniques - posture, eye contact, gesture, use of visual aids.

Language - use of a variety of appropriate language structure and vocabulary.

The topic, context, target audience, and role of the competitor will be sent out one month before the competition.

Class 8 (Age 8-9 Years)	3 min
Class 9 (Age 10-11 Years)	4 min
Class 10 (Age 12-13 Years)	5 min
Class 11 (Age 14-16 Years)	5 min plus an interview*
Class 12 (OPEN)	7 min plus an interview*

*Interview (if appropriate) - the ability to give relevant answers and elaborate and justify points made.

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IMPROMPTU SPEAKING

Create and tell a story around an object provided by the Adjudicator- 4 minutes given for preparation & performance – all competitors are taken to a quiet room and then, one at a time, they are given 2 minutes in a quiet space with the object to prepare.

Class 13 (Age 8-9 Years)

Class 14 (Age 10-11 Years)

A subject will be selected by the competitor from a list set by the Adjudicator- same procedure as class 13 & 14.

Class 15 (Age 12-13 Years)

Class 16 (Age 14-16 Years)

Class 17 (Age Over 16)

CHORAL SPEAKING (*poems must be memorised*) – At least 10 Members per Group

Movements, sounds and gestures **CAN** be incorporated but a conductor is not permitted.

Class 18 (Age 6-7 Years) Own choice of one poem between 2-3 minutes

Class 19 (Age 8-9 Years) Own choice of two contrasting poems
Whole programme not to exceed 5 minutes.

Class 20 (Age 10-11 Years) Own choice of two contrasting poems
Whole programme not to exceed 7 minutes.

Class 21 (Age 12-15 Years) Own choice of two or three contrasting poems
Whole programme not to exceed 10 minutes.

In the following classes for **Dramatic monologues, duologues, and group drama** chosen pieces must be from published works. Also that they should be performed from memory and that hand props and simple scenery can be used, but, any setting up time must be limited to 1 minute and the same applies to clearing the space afterwards.
